One topic of discussion was the importance of more First Nations representation.</li> <li>The Advisory Groups and RWACs will share important correspondence on an ongoing basis.</li> </ul>

Wildlife Disease Association Conference	<ul> <li>PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION</li> <li>Helen Schwantje provided a presentation on the upcoming international Wildlife Disease Association Conference in Victoria, July 28 – August 1, 2025.</li> <li>The Wildlife Disease Association is a leading international scientific organization representing wildlife health.</li> <li>Dr. Schwantje spoke to the recent conference in Australia and its focus on Indigenous ways of knowing.</li> <li>The Victoria conference will build on this, and highlight approaches in North America, especially British Columbia. They anticipate 450-500 attendees.</li> <li>She encouraged MWAC members to get involved as presenters and attendees.</li> <li>DISCUSSION</li> <li>Bats and white nose syndrome would be a good addition to the topics; and Chronic Wasting Disease in cervids is a priority.</li> <li>Several MWAC members expressed an interest in participating.</li> <li>Council informed the Minister of the opportunity to attend the conference.</li> <li>ACTION</li> <li>Judith Cullington to share Helen Schwantje's contact information with Council.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>It was noted that CWD is a high priority issue that merits quick action to prevent further spread. There is significant impact for people who rely on these cervids for food. The Minister would like to meet with Adam Ford to discuss this further.</li> </ul>			
	• The Minister asked Council for feedback on how Council is working, and how it can be improved.			
	• The Minister would like to meet again with Council once the mandate letters have been released.
